Foreword

This has been incredibly a challenging year for AFREKID. Global organ trafficking was on our agenda as well as the World Health Organisation (WHO) and other international organizations. Africa remains excluded from renal replacement therapy programmes. African kidney patients are disproportionately represented on dialysis and transplant waiting list with the majority dying waiting because of chronic shortage of kidney donors. Despite these challenges, we delivered our promises.

I am happy to report that we achieved registration with the Charity Commission. A large part of the year was spent in ensuring that AFREKID position itself on to the global while building its capacity and that our objectives remained relevant and practical, translating this to day to day action and ensuring that all work is rigorously monitored.

During the year, we created many partnerships with service providers and voluntary and community organisations. We continued to engage with our members to ensure that our service is fit for purpose. We engaged with the NHS renal units and transplant centres ensuring that patient needs are met.

We are very pleased that so many of you participated in surveys because that ensures that we do represent our member's interests. Many researches and health indices show that African and Caribbean communities have a higher incidence of kidney failure than the national average, lack access to mainstream services and have:

- Poor health conditions,
- Inadequate health provision,
- And are failed by health services

I would like to thank all our funders, who have been particularly helpful, not just in providing funds, but in supporting the work of AFREKID from advising us on our project to involving us in key partnership. We work particularly closely with those providing dialysis services and kidney transplantation to see how we could develop shared knowledge and joint working. I would like to thank those organisations for their help and support.

My fellow Board members need a special mention. We have had lively debates at meetings and all have made a full and vigorous contribution to setting AFREKID agenda and direction. I am pleased that most of the Board is standing again and that we have some new members.

I would like to thank the members of the Policy and Resource Sub-Committee for all the additional work they have put in.

Finally, the Board would like to thank volunteers who provided administrative support and students from the University of East Anglia and French students on work experience.

Serving the needs of African kidney patients

This was a year of significant achievement in our programme. We began with ambitious plan to register as a charity and this was achieved. We also had to flex tremendously to respond to growing challenges of global organ trafficking known as tourism transplant. This is exploiting the poor in developing countries. We participated in many initiatives to raise awareness of kidney disease and organ donors. The issues that African renal patients face are manifold. Some of the issues we tackled are:

- Lack of information on available services
- Unmet special needs for those on dialysis, especially children
- Inequality in access renal services
- No support services especially post kidney transplant

Due to resource constraint, we were not able to meet some of our targets.

Achievements and performance

We gained national recognition of our work and we have been invited to participate in the UK National Transplant Taskforce and World Kidney Day on 13th March 2008.

Financial review

The Financial Activities for the year are set out in the financial statements in this report. The charity's incoming resources increased from £3,722 to £6,221. The charity intends to apply for core funding this coming year.

Future developments

Plans are underway to employ a Project Officer and an Administrator, develop children, adult service and set up a regional office in Africa. Priority work areas are:

In the UK

- Promoting kidney donation.
- Supporting patients and carers.
- Initiating research into African renal diseases and care.

In Africa

- Influencing the initiation of renal units
- Supporting dialysis units/centres
- Supporting patients and Carers

AFREKID would not survive without member support and those who give up time and energy to help us with consultation and attend workshops and make sure that we understand their issues. We hope to collect and publish some of the key examples of good practice in the following years.

I look forward to another year working with all our partners, developing a valuable renal care services for African people. I would like to thank all our Board members for the strong role they have played in directing AFREKID.



Activities and Project Reports

KIDNEY DONATION AWARENESS

Kidney donation awareness is central to our work. During the year, we participated in a number of awareness campaign programmes to encourage people to donate kidneys and prevention through awareness of risk factors. We distributed over 2,000 leaflets, participated in UK Transplant programmes, Transplant Week and TV and BBC Radio Norfolk and Suffolk in East Anglia.

AFREKID reached out to many individuals and through community groups. We work with other African voluntary and community groups and organisations to widen our awareness outreach programme.

CareEast Project

CareEast project is funded by European Social Fund (ESF) through National Extension College (NEC) in Cambridge. The project has been giving AFREKID the skills to manage and run the organisation effectively. CareEast is a training programme for those working in health and social care in the East of England

AFREKID participated in the programme with immense gain in administrative management and financial accounting

E-HELPER Project

E-Helper project is funded by Norwich City Council and managed through Citizens Advice Bureau (CAB).



Our members find helpful information on the internet. During the year, fifteen (15) members benefited.



Melanoma Awareness

Melanoma is a cancer which usually starts in the skin, either in a mole or in normal-looking skin. About 7000 people in the UK are diagnosed with melanoma each year. Although melanoma is common in people with fair skin, those with weak immune system due to taking immunosuppressant medication after transplant are at greater risk. The main cause is ultraviolet (UV) rays



from the sun. During the year, we handed over 500 leaflets on melanoma, kidney transplant and sun bathing awareness for kidney transplant patients. About 6 workshops were carried out with 75 participants.

STOP Organ Trafficking

The international trade in human organs is on the increase fuelled by growing demand as well as unscrupulous traffickers and brokers who target the poor.



In one case, a broker charged £100,000 and gave the ill-informed donor a paltry £2,000.

AFREKID is leading a campaign against organ trafficking. During the year, we handed over petition to the World Health Organisation (WHO) calling for an end and regulation of organ trafficking. Workshops were also organized to bring awareness of the extent of the issue. This coming year we plan awareness campaigns in UK, EU and Africa.

BME Transplant Network – BMETN

AFREKID has been involved in the formation of BME Transplant Network (BMETN), a national transplant network of Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) patient support groups, organisations and individuals.

BMETN's aims are:

- To *develop* effective campaign for tissue and organ donation awareness in BME communities
- To *promote* tissue and organ donation awareness in BME communities
- To *build* a strong BME national transplant network
- To *support* BME transplant support groups, organisations and individuals

During the year, AFREKID lead the consultation on behalf of BMETN. We also lead the recruitment of the Board of Trustees and their first meeting on 6th August 2007 in Cambridge. We are also involved in web development and logo design of BME Transplant.

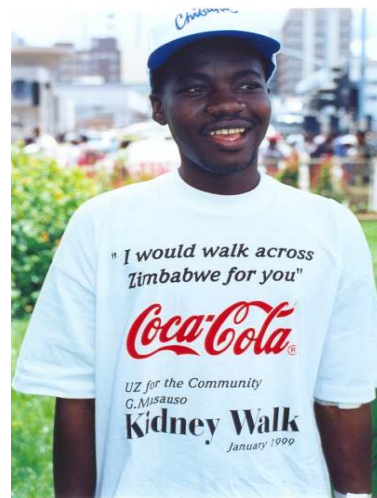

The total income for the year ending 31 March 2007 was £6,221, an increase of 60% from 2005/06. The breakdown of the income by categories is shown on Figures 1a and 1b below.

Figure 1a: AFREKID Income 2006/07

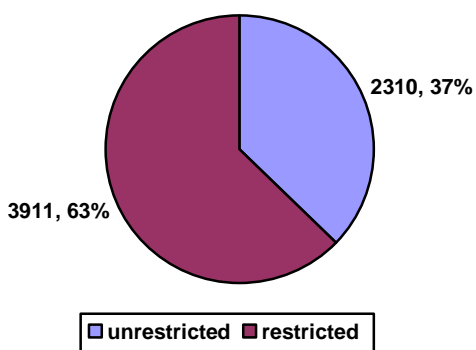
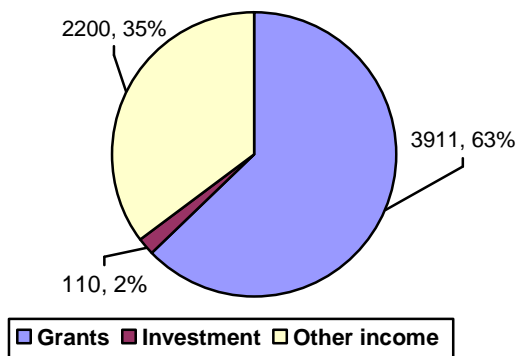
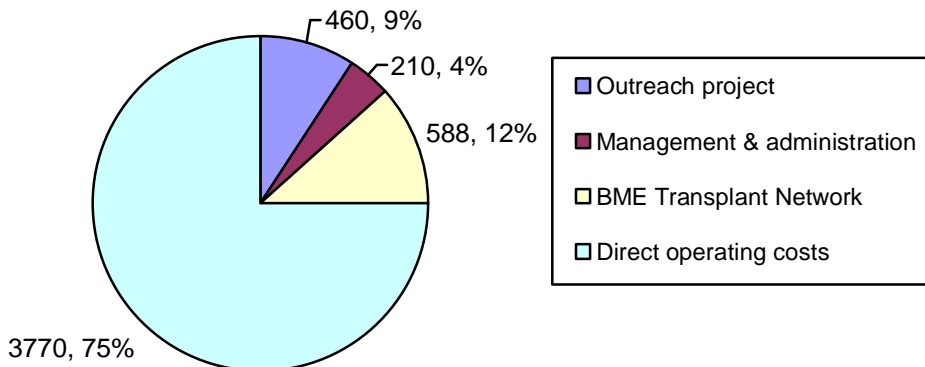


Figure 1b: AFREKID Income by category



The total expenditure for the year was £3,980 which is a 59% increase from the previous year. The breakdown of this expenditure by cost and by project is shown on figure 2 below.

Figure 2: AFREKID Expenses by cost and project 2006/07



AFREKID carries £3,429 reserves of which £1,101 is restricted funding. The restricted funds are mainly for Community Champions Fund which has respective year in June. These accounts are done with a March year end. The trustees are happy that in its second year of operation, AFREKID managed to strengthen its financial position while ensuring that the financial resources were in place for the objectives of the year 2006/2007.

The trustees have established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets ("the free reserve") held by the charity should be between 3 and 6 months of the resources expended which equates to £9,750 in general funds. At present, the free reserves, which amount to £3,429 are outside these parameters and the trustees are considering ways of improving this position.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

The trustees, who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act, present their annual report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 2007. The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 in preparing the Annual Report and accounts of the charity.

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES RESPONSIBILITIES

Company law requires the trustees to prepare accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the surplus or deficit of the charity for that year.

In preparing those accounts, the trustees are required to:

- (i) Select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently.
- (ii) Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent.
- (iii) Prepare the accounts on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue operating.
- (iv) State whether the policies adopted are in accordance with the Companies Act 1985 and with applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the accounts.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time, the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the accounts comply with the Companies Act 1985.

They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing Document

Africa Resource for Kidney Diseases (AFREKID) is a company limited by guarantee with charitable status which is governed by a memorandum and articles of association. It was incorporated as a company in England and Wales on 14th April 2005. It was registered as a charity on 6th August 2007.

Appointment of Trustees

New trustees are appointed by a majority of trustees in office at that time.

Trustee induction and training

The trustees are currently reviewing the procedures in place for trustees' induction and training by reference to guidance published by the Charity Commission.

The day to day affairs of the charity are run by the trustees of the charity who are also the directors of the company.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

Organisational Structure

The charity has a board of trustees who meet four times a year and are responsible for its strategic direction and policy. The trustees appoint a Volunteer Co-ordinator to manage the day to day operations of the charity because at present, the charity does not have paid staff and plans are underway to employ a part-time Project Officer and Administrator.

Risk Management

The trustees actively review the major risks which the charity faces on a regular basis and believe that increasing reserves from current levels, combined with an annual review of the controls over key financial systems will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions. The trustees have also examined other operational and business risks faced by the charity and confirm that they have established systems to mitigate the significant risks.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The charity's objectives and activities continue to be:

to relieve the financial hardships of African renal patients in Africa and the UK, in particular but not exclusively, by making grants for items, services and facilities

to promote and protect the health of African renal patients in Africa and the UK, in particular but not exclusively, by initiating renal replacement therapy, developing renal support services and supporting kidney donors and Carers

to advance the education of the public in renal diseases, including promoting research and disseminating the results thereof

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

A review of the charity's achievements and performance are contained in the annual report.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

A review of the charity's financial performance during the year is contained in the annual report.

Reserve policy

The trustees have established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets ("the free reserve") held by the charity should be between 3 and 6 months of the resources expended which equates to £9,750 in general funds. At this level, the trustees feel that they would be able to continue the current activities of the charity in the event of a significant drop in funding. In the event of such an occurrence, it would obviously be necessary to consider how the funding would be replaced or activities changed. At present, the free reserves, which amount to £3,429 are outside these parameters and the trustees are considering ways of improving this position.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

A review of the charity's future developments is contained in the annual report.

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) BASIS OF PREPARATION OF ACCOUNTS

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and include the results of the charity's operations, which are described in the Report of the Trustees and all of which are continuing. They have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP) issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 1985.

(b) INCOMING RESOURCES

Incoming resources are recognised in the year in which the charity is entitled to the receipt, and the amount can be measured with reasonable certainty. Income is only deferred when the charity has to fulfil conditions before becoming entitled to it or where the donor has specified that the income is to be expended in a future year.

(c) RESOURCES EXPENDED

Includes all expenditure incurred by the charity other than that which has been capitalised.

(d) COMPUTER EQUIPMENT

Depreciation is calculated at 33.3% using Straight Line Method.

(e) CASH FLOW STATEMENTS

The charity, being a small company of small size within the meaning of the Companies Act 1985, has used the exemption provided by Financial Reporting Standard No. 1 under which they are not required to include a cash flow statement as part of their accounts.
